- Regularly using checklists and other observation and assessment tools.
- Effectively communicating verbal and written observations.
- Contributing to multidisciplinary team work connected to Native communities.
- Choosing, adapting and designing educational material and activities aimed at promoting healthy lifestyles.
- Assessing the risk level and urgency to act in situations where people's health is threatened.
- Using appropriate approach, communication and health care techniques.
- Developing a professional identity.
- Applying response procedures appropriate for the Cree culture.
- Identifying resources available in the community.
- Contributing to the provision of health care and preventive measures in the case of certain illnesses. Demonstrating the ability to apply first aid treatment and CPR in an emergency situation.

Entrance Requirements

In order to be eligible to this program, a candidate must have a secondary school diploma (SSD) or have received training that is deemed sufficient by the Cégep.

Every application will be assessed by the Continuing Education and Outside Markets Division in collaboration with the appropriate department of the Cégep de l'Abitibi-Témiscamingue.

In addition, the candidate must satisfy one of the following three conditions:

- Have interrupted studies for at least two consecutive sessions or a full year;
- Be covered by an agreement between the Cégep and an employer or by a government program;
- Have completed at least one year of postsecondary studies, over a period of one year or more.
