ACQUIRE THE FOLLOWING SKILLS

The Attestation of College Studies (ACS) in Police Technology is an intensive training program meant for candidates such as you who have a recruitment commitment from a police organization. This program will allow you to acquire the following skills:

- » to learn emergency care as a first responder
- » to defend yourself against physical blows
- » to defend yourself in hand-to-hand combat
- » to meet the physical requirements of police work
- » to analyze the occupational and organizational aspects of police officer work
- » to adapt the principles and basic techniques of communication to the police intervention context
- » to use observation methods
- » to write reports
- to determine the raie of the police officer in different situations involving young people who are in trouble or young offenders
- » to plan and apply intervention strategies that are preventive, repressive or community-oriented
- » to intervene in situations of a private nature

- » to evaluate the powers and duties of a police officer in criminal matters
- » to record a crime that has been committed
- » to record an offence that has been committed to a Quebec municipal bylaw or law
- » to exercise the powers and duties of a police officer in criminal matters
- » to exercise the powers and duties of a police officer regarding Quebec laws and municipal bylaws
- » to analyze and communicate proof of criminal offences
- » to carry out police intervention in criminal events
- » to intervene with individuals in a crisis situation
- » to exercise the powers and duties of a police officer in matters concerning road safety
- » to contrai a violent individual
- » to put specialized police communication techniques into practice
- » to carry out police intervention related to traffic and traffic accidents
- » to carry out police intervention related to driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs and to use defensive driving techniques




TRAINING CONTINUUM

If you meet admission requirements at the end of your training, you will join the ÉNPQ to participate in the First Nation Basic Training Program in Police Patrolling (BTPPP). BTPPP is mandatory to access police & patrolling practice.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You must:

- have a written recruitment commitment from a police organization
- meet l'École Nationale de Police du Québec (ÉNPQ or Quebec National Police School) eligibility requirements foreseen in ÉNPQ College Education Regulations
- » have a Secondary School Diploma (SSD or training deemed sufficient and meet one of the three following conditions:
 - 1. have quit your studies for al least two consecutive semesters or one year,
 - be targeted by an agreement concluded between the Cégep and an employer or by a governmental program,
 - 3. have completed at least one year of postsecondary studies spread out over a period of one year or more or
 - 4. the person holds a degree in professional studies.
